

TERN VERGE X10 » \$1,800

Folding bikes are nothing new. But the fact that new brands are bringing them to market shows the renewed health of the segment.

The Tern doesn't fold the smallest, nor is it the lightest folding bike. But it's incredibly easy to collapse (lower the saddle, flip two levers and fold), and more significantly, it rides like a real bike. Really. The Verge X10 is impressively stiff and the geometry is dialed — not too twitchy or too slow to respond. It's perfect for shooting around town, hopping in and out of trains or cabs, or just going for a cruise.

They are also versatile. Tern puts a luggage truss on the head tube of every model that allows the use of a frame-mounted rack, bag or basket. Tern also sells a rolling travel bag for its bikes that looks like standard luggage. ternbicycles.com
